Municipal libraries come to the rescue of learners

Since the first week of November, municipal library services have come to the rescue of learners during the current exam period.

At Gerald Sekoto public library, there has been a tremendous increase in the number of learners who visit the library on a daily basis. During the year, between 20 and 30 learners would visit the library daily, however, lately the figures have increased to 85 learners a day.

In comparison to other months, all study rooms at the library are fully booked, whereby learners would be allowed to use the auditorium for study purposes.

In an attempt to ease the over crowding situation at libraries, the library bought new tables and chairs. The furnisher would also be distributed to other libraries in Steve Thswete Local Municipality.

During this period, learners can make copies of study material for free, using only waste paper.

Learners who produce their identity books are also allowed to take study guides into the study rooms from the reference section.
