NOTICE OF WATER RESTRICTIONS

Notice is hereby given in terms of Section 21 of the Municipal Systems Act as well as the Water Services By-Laws that at a Special Council meeting held on 25 October 2016 Council considered an item on Water Restrictions and resolved as follows per Resolution SC30/10/2016:

- "1 **THAT** in terms of Section 54(1) of the Water Services By-laws, the following water restrictions be imposed in the Steve Tshwete Local Municipal area with effect from 1 November 2016:
- 1.1 The watering of gardens by means of hosepipes or by means of irrigation systems.
 - 1.2 The watering of sport facilities at schools.
 - 1.3 The cleaning of vehicles or driveways by means of hosepipes.
 - 1.4 No filling of swimming pools with municipal water.
- 2 **THAT** a fine of R1 500,00 be imposed for any contravention of the above-mentioned measures.
- 3 **THAT** it be required of all Traffic Officers, Peace Officers, Building Inspectors to ensure that the above prohibitions are strictly enforced.
- 4 **THAT** in terms of Section 8.14 of the Tariff Policy, as approved on the budget, the following restriction tariffs apply from 1 November 2016 with first billing run in December 2016:
- 4.1 Level 1 restrictions (water source below 60%)
 - (a) Residential

For the first 6 kilolitres	Free
7-10 kilolitres	R 7,55 per kilolitre
10-20 kilolitres	R13,20 per kilolitre
Above 20 kilolitres	R14,05 per kilolitre

(b) Business, industries,
flats and schools R10,45 per kilolitre

4.2 Level 2 restrictions (water source below 40%)

(a) Residential

For the first 6 kilolitres	Free
7-10 kilolitres	R 7,55 per kilolitre
10-20 kilolitres	R16,25 per kilolitre
Above 20 kilolitres	R17,28 per kilolitre

(b) Business, industries,
flats and schools R12,88 per kilolitre

4.3 Level 3 restrictions (water source below 20%)

(a) Residential

For the first 6 kilolitres	Free
7-10 kilolitres	R 7,55 per kilolitre
10-20 kilolitres	R20,30 per kilolitre
Above 20 kilolitres	R21,60 per kilolitre

(b) Business, industries,
flats and schools R16,06 per kilolitre

5 THAT the irrigation of grass lawns in the road reserve using water from boreholes also be prohibited until the water resource reaches at least 60%."

Further note that the water restrictions will remain in place until the water resource reaches at least 60% or an alternative raw water source has been secured.

Based on the current level of the water resource, a Level 2 water restriction tariffs be implemented.
