2ND PHASE UPGRADING OF BOSKRANS WASTE WATER TREATMENT WORKS PACKAGE 2- NEW INLET WORKS PUMPSTATION – MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL WORKS

In terms of Section 110 of the Municipal Finance Management Act, 2003 (No. 56 of 2003), tenders are hereby invited for the upgrading of the inletworks at the Boskrans Waste Water Treatment Works.

Tenders are hereby invited for the 2nd Phase Upgrading of Boskrans Waste Water Treatment Works – Package 2 New inlet works pumpstation – mechanical and electrical works, in the Steve Tshwete municipal region. The works comprises of the electrical / mechanical electrical portion of the works. **Tenderers should have a CIDB contractor grading of 5MEPE/ 6ME or higher.**

Box 14, Middelburg, Mpumalanga 1050, Tel: (013) 249-7365 & Fax: (013) 243-2550) against payment of a non-refundable tender amount of R500,00. Only bank guaranteed cheques or cash will be accepted. Cheques shall be made payable to the Steve Tshwete Local Municipality.

Duly completed tender enclosed in a sealed envelope marked "TENDER NO: BS10/05/2018: 2ND PHASE UPGRADING OF BOSKRANS WASTE WATER TREATMENT WORKS – PACKAGE 2 NEW INLET WORKS PUMPSTATION – MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL WORKS" with the name of the tenderer, shall be deposited in the tender box provided at the Steve Tshwete Local Municipality on the 1st floor, Civic Centre, Wanderers Avenue, Middelburg, before 12H00 on 04/07/2018. The tenders will be opened in public.

A compulsory clarification meeting with representatives of the employer will take place at the gate of the Inlet Works (lat 25.738606°, long 29.449324°) MIDDELBURG on 20/06/2018, starting at 10h00. Contract documentation will not be available on site, and the engineer will not be available for inspection purposes on any other occasion.

Bidders will be evaluated on functionality whereby 65 points has to be attained before financial proposals can be looked at. A preferential point system shall apply whereby a contract will be allocated to a tenderer in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, Act No 5 of 2000 and as defined in the conditions of tender in the tender document, read in conjunction with the supply chain management policy of Steve Tshwete Local Municipality where 80 points will be allocated in respect of price and 20 points in respect of B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution. Tenderers must have the necessary skills, experience and capacity to perform the required work.

No awards will be made to a person:

- Who is in the service of the state;
- If that person is not a natural person, of which any director, manager, principal shareholder or stakeholder is a person in the service of the state; and/or
- Who is an advisor or consultant contracted with the municipality or municipal entity.

The municipality reserves the right to withdraw any invitation to tender and/or to re-advertise or to reject any tender or to accept a part of it. The municipality does not bind itself to accepting the lowest tender or award a contract to the bidder scoring the highest number of points.

NB : Only locally produced or manufactured goods, meeting the stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content, will be considered in line with Regulation 8(2) of the Municipal Supply Chain Management Regulations and National Treasury Circular 69."

The exchange rate to be used for the calculation of local production and content must be the exchange rate published by the South-African Reserve Bank (SARB) at 12:00 on the date of advertisement of the bid; and Only the South-African Bureau of Standards (SABS) approved technical specification number SATS 12863:2011 must be used to calculate local content.

Contractors who have the following are eligible to tender and must provide such proof:

- Pre-qualifying criteria for preferential procurement shall be applied. Bids will be pre-qualified on two (2) criteria for preferential procurement. Only bidders that meet the following pre-qualifying criteria shall be considered:
- Criteria 1: Exempted Micro Enterprises (EME) or Qualifying Small Enterprises (QSE). A sworn affidavit for EME/QSEs (accessible from <http://www.dti.gov.za>) must be attached. A tender that fails to meet this pre-qualifying criteria stipulated is an unacceptable tender.
