Scope of Required Work and Services

SPECIFICATIONS

1. Purpose

The Municipality intends to appoint a CIDB registered contractor to supply, install, test and commission a 5 Ton ProStar or equivalent electronic hoist for pump station at Vaalbank water Treatment plant.

2. Project Description

The principal features of the scope of works do not limit the responsibility of the *contractor*. He shall perform all work and furnish all labour, equipment and material to ensure the satisfactory operation of the electronic hoist. Material and devices, which are normally part of the supplied equipment and are essential for the proper operation of this equipment or are necessary for the proper functioning of the whole installation, shall be supplied even if not explicitly called for in these specifications.

The *contractor* will provide the following:

- Supply of 1 × 5 ton 6 m height of lift complete with ultra-lower headroom crawl and dual speed ProStar/Equivalent rope hoist
- 1 × remote combo system. (1 × transmitter 4way + emergency stop, double speed, 1 × receiver)
- 1 × 20m downshop power supply (brackets, tensioners and collectors)
- Scaffolding
- Labour to install downshop and hoist, testing and commissioning of the unit

3. Description Of The Site And Access

2.1 Location of site

The site is located at the existing Vaalbank Water treatment Works, accessible via dirt road off the R35 towards Middelburg.

2.2 Access to site

Tenderer's must allow for all conditions on site in their tenders, since extra claims arising from difficult site conditions in respect to transport, handling, loading, off-loading, labour, housing, etc., will not be entertained. These include road entrances that may have to be kept closed overnight.

4. Details Of The Works

4.1 Brief description of works

The scope of works require the supplying, installation, testing and operating of a new 5 Ton ProStar/equivalent electronic lifting equipment. This unit would be used for lifting of motors, pumps and pipes as and when required.

4.2 Construction in confined areas

It may be necessary for the contractor to work within confined areas.

It will be necessary for the contractor to work in areas where additional work will be required to

ensure that the existing plant keep up with the required production without interruption. Said work will be included in the pricing and will be described in the method statements prepared by the contractor.

Except where provided for in the specifications, no additional payment shall be made for work done in restricted areas.

5. Construction Programme

The contractor should clearly indicate the time frame for completion of this project.

6. Time for completion

The maximum time allowed for the completion of the project is five weeks.

7. Facilities Required On Site

7.1 Facilities for the engineer

A site office for the engineer is not required.

7.2 Facilities for the contractor

The following facilities are required on the site for the contractor in addition to the facilities required by the contractor for his own purposes:

Ablution and sanitary facilities

Ablution and sanitary facilities are available on site. The contractor shall maintain the facilities in a clean and hygienic state for the duration of the project period.

7.3 Site establishment

No site establishment is required

8. Site Facilities Available

8.1 Power supply

Electrical power cannot be guaranteed by the municipality. During power failures and shortages, the contractor must make his own arrangements for the provision of electricity e.g. for testing.

9. Supply Of Materials

All material to be used in the works is to be supplied by the contractor.

The contractor shall ensure that the work is not delayed due to the lack of materials on site, by placing orders for material required under this project as soon as an official order is received.

10. Execution Of The Works

The execution of this project is primarily the supplying, installation, testing and operating of a new 5

Ton ProStar/equivalent electronic lifting equipment. The employer shall not be responsible or liable for any losses or damages incurred by the contractor irrespective if it is due to the execution of work as per specifications or as directed in writing or verbally by the employer.

10.1 Inspection by the engineer

The employer shall upon completion of the project inspect the effectiveness and quality of the project for approval. The contractor shall also be responsible for clearing the site after completing the project.

11. Occupational Health and Safety Requirements

It is a requirement of this project that the contractor shall provide a safe working environment and to direct all his activities in such a manner that his employees and any other persons who may be directly affected by his activities are not exposed to hazards to their health and safety.

The Contractor will advise the Vaalbank Water Treatment Works Plant Supervisor minimum of 1-2 days prior to any activity that could disrupt the Works in any form.

13. Unauthorised Persons

The Contractor shall keep unauthorized persons away from his site at all times.
