CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This municipal bidding document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.

C3 SCOPE OF WORKS / SPECIFICATIONS

1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

Service Providers are required to do replacement of paving brick and concrete mix as and when required in MP313 licensed areas for the period of 3 months.

PS1 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

It is the employers' responsibility to ensure safety at the work place and to make workers aware of the dangers at the work place.

The inherent dangers involved with the excavation of trenches, joint holes and installation of cables are:

- Injury to Public: falling into trenches or joint holes;
- Injury by hand tools; e.g. pick, shovel etc.
- Damage to vehicles driving into trenches or joint holes;
- Injury of persons unauthorised to be in the working area who are not recorded on the workers register for the area where work is being carried out;
- Injury of persons when loading and using cable jacks;
- Safe working distance from truck mounted crane to prevent serious body injuries;
- When working with a cable car, injuries or loss of limbs could occur;
- Cable rollers could result in injuries or loss of finger;
- Passing traffic could result in an accident causing injuries or even death;
- Damaging of identified services could result in financial loss to contractor;

2. COMPULSORY PROCEDURES

The above identified hazards are not the only dangers and Steve Tshwete Municipality, Electrical Department has the following procedures in place that must be complied with:

- 2.1. There must be a qualified first aider, with his first aid box, on site at all times in terms of Councils' first aid policy;
- 2.2. All workers of the contractor who will be involved with any work or on site must be on a register that they have been on the Occupational Health and Safety Induction course provided by Human Resources. The document, of which the contractor will have a copy, will be held at the office of the Town Electrical Engineer.
- 2.3. All workers of the contractor who will be involved with any work or on site must understand and accept the following standing instructions:
 - Pre Task Planning and Risk Assessment

2.5. The workers who comply with the above must have an ID card verifying compliance. The card will be valid for the duration of the contract.

3. MONITORING OF PROCESS
